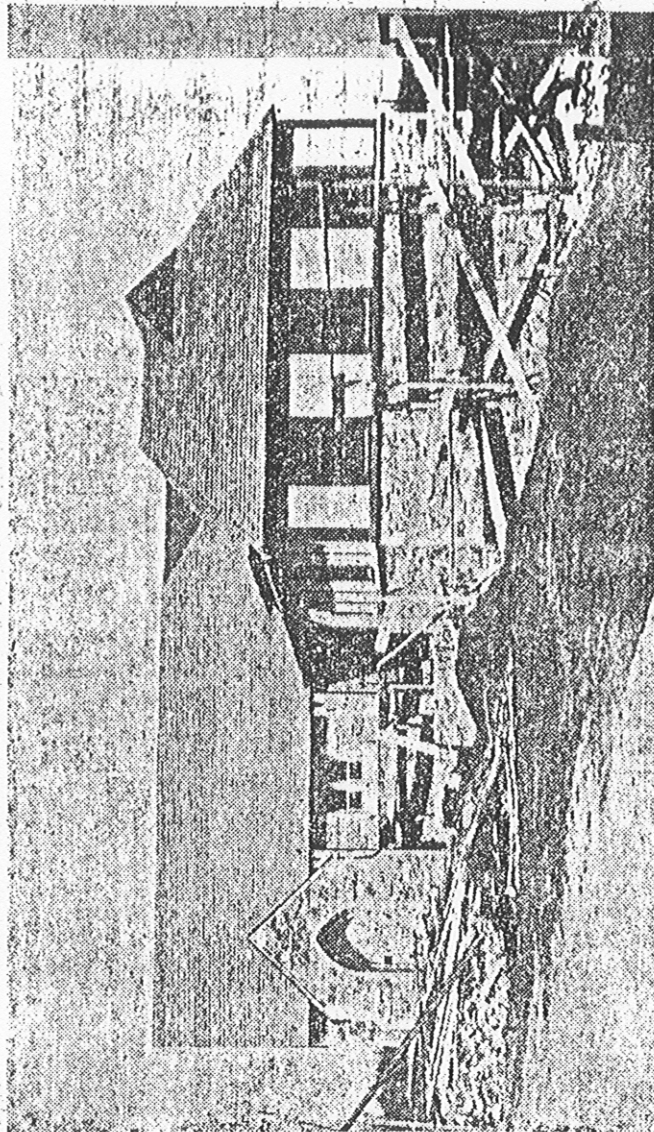


New Bonny Oaks School Chapel
